Partnership Proposal For Use of Family Life Church Building

February 16, 2015

Background

The Mississippi Gulf Coast YMCA has enjoyed a long tradition steeped in partnership. The YMCA has offered after school programs and summer camps hosted in schools and churches across the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Currently, the YMCA is housed at Taconi Elementary in Ocean Springs, Jeff Davis and North Bay Elementary in Biloxi, East Hancock Elementary in Kiln and Vancleave United Methodist Church in Vancleave. All of our camps are licensed by the Mississippi State Department of Health. The YMCA also runs a program at the College Park Elementary in Gautier. Over 275 children are currently served across the three coastal counties. During the after school program, children participate in many activities including, but not limited to devotions, homework assistance, arts and crafts, health and wellness, science and technology and social responsibility. During the summer months four sites (including Gautier) host full day camps for approximately 350 children. Each day of summer day camp is exciting for campers; they include the above mentioned activities as well as weekly local field trips to such places as local splash pads, parks, the local library and fire stations.

Of those served, 20% receive some sort of financial assistance. Parents in need of financial assistance must first apply to the Department of Early Child Hood Care Development, a federally supported state agency referred to as "The District". If they are declined by the District and because the YMCA is a charitable 501(c)3 organization, a significant portion of that assistance comes from donations from individuals and businesses to the YMCA's Strong Kids Scholarship Program that reduces fees paid by families in financial need. This program is a vital lifeline for single and two parent working families who trust the YMCA to care for their children and develop them in a healthy spirit, mind and body.

Proposal

The YMCA requests that First United Methodist Church of Gautier consider allowing use of the Family Life Building for after school care during the school year and a full day camp during holidays and the summer months.

Upon dismissal on days that schools are in session, children from local elementary schools will be transported to the church by YMCA Staff using a bus or van. We would to request an area at the church to park the van or bus when not in use. The After School Program ends at 6:00 p.m. During Summer Day Camp and most school holidays, the camp operating hours are 5:30 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Parents will drop children off for day camp.

Children will have easy access to the existing playground and large area south of the building for outdoor games and activities.

The YMCA will handle custodial care for the area(s) that we occupy on any given day.

The YMCA will provide a certificate of liability insurance listing the two churches as additional insured parties.

BENEFITS- The location is in a safe, peaceful setting in a modern facility. The synergy of being located practically right in the middle of Gautier will benefit both the children and the YMCA. Usage of the facility allows additional program offerings for children and families thereby improving the quality of life for all in the Gautier area.

The YMCA recognizes that the building remains the property of First United Methodist Church of Gautier. Further there are many families that will depend on the YMCA to provide care for their children, and as such the organization must ensure the long term sustainability of the program. Therefore the YMCA requests a minimum three year agreement for use of the building facilities.

Conclusion

The YMCA is excited about the possibility of what such a partnership means for all organizations involved, and thanks the Pastor and Board of Trustees of First United Methodist Church of Gautier for entertaining this proposal. We are open to alterations, but present the clearest vision possible for proper evaluation. Final agreement to this partnership occurs after approval from the church board of trustees.
